Newsbrief

President Md. Abdul Hamid and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina greeted the people of the country including taxpayers, officials and employees of the National Board of Revenue on the occasion of the 'Revenue Conference-2023' beginning today. On the eve of the day, they issued separate messages wishing all programmes undertaken on the occasion of 'Revenue Conference' a success. President Md. Abdul Hamid in his message said, the inauguration of the newly constructed revenue building in Agargaon, Dhaka by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is a new addition to the infrastructure development of the country. In her message, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said, the greatest Bangalee of all time, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established the National Board of Revenue in 1972 with the dream of building a self-reliant country through economic growth.

President Md. Abdul Hamid and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina greeted all concerned including advisers, patrons, guardians, children and teenagers of the Banglabandhu Shishu Kishore Mela marking its 8th national conference beginning today. They issued separate messages yesterday. President Abdul Hamid in his message said, with the aim of realizing Bangabandhu's dream and nurturing the new generation in the spirit of the liberation war, the organization is doing commendable work in developing the talent of the children and teenagers through nationwide cultural activities. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, in her message, said, Bangabandhu had immense compassion for children. He included special provisions in the Constitution regarding the responsibilities and duties of the state for the welfare of children, the Premier added.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is scheduled to inaugurate a two-day revenue conference tomorrow which will be held at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in Dhaka, said NBR Chairman Abu Hena Md. Rahmatul Muneem at a press conference at NBR conference room yesterday.

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader said, BNP secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir lied over the voter turnout in recent by-polls to six constituencies in the country. The Minister said this in a statement yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Dr. Hasan Mahmud said, if anyone is found involved in spreading rumors and confusion over textbook, actions will be taken against him or her. The Minister said these while replying to questions of journalists after unveiling covers of several books on the premises of Amar Ekushey Book Fair at Suhrawardy Udyan in Dhaka yesterday.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Zahid Maleque said, the present government, led by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, provides free treatment to the people while BNP destroyed the eye sights of people through grenade attack during its tenure. He told this at the inaugural function of free surgical operation of cataract and eye treatment programme at Manikganj 250-bed general hospital yesterday.

Education Minister Dr. Dipu Moni stressed upon the need for introducing smart politics aiming to build 'Smart Bangladesh'. The Minister also said, in smart politics, every political party should give priority first to the interest of the country while falsehood, propaganda, misleading people and burning people can never be a part of smart politics in smart Bangladesh. She said this to the journalists at Chandpur Circuit House yesterday.

Local Government, Rural Department and Cooperatives Minister Tajul Islam said, students must be made efficient through proper knowledge and training to build a developed and Smart Bangladesh, envisioned by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, by 2041. He made the remark while speaking at a civic rally after inaugurating a four-storey building of Lalpur Nazrul Islam High School at Titas upazila in Cumilla, according to a press release yesterday.

Railways Minister Advocate Nurul Islam Sujon said, the present government has carried out massive development in education sector. He advised the newly enrolled students to prepare themselves to work for the country's development in future. The Minister was speaking at a fresher reception at Boda Pathraj College in Boda upazila of Panchagarh yesterday.

A total of 14 dengue patients were admitted with no death to different hospitals across the country during the past 24 hours till 8 am yesterday while Bangladesh recorded no death with 11 coronavirus positive cases, a daily statement of the Directorate General of Health Services said yesterday.
